Introduction



The Philippine Relief and Development Services Inc (PHILRADS) has been an able partner of the church and the government in relief and development since its ministry in 1980. Through its programs and services, PHILRADS ensures the realization of God’s Vision and Plan for the Philippine Society being one “where there is no poor, where there is justice and equality for all and freedom to worship God” (Isiah 9:7). Thus, guided with this vision, PHILRADS delivers a package of programs and services that are responsive to the needs of the poor, the helpless and the needy.

Key Accomplishment

I. RELIEF RESPONSE AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM

Preparing for and responding to disasters remained as a major focus of PHILRADS ministry in 2019. We conducted 10 relief operation projects throughout the year, served about 7,988 families or 41,065 individuals, mostly with emergency family food packs and cash assistance. Majority of our recipients were affected by typhoons and earthquakes which had displaced thousands of Filipinos.



But we went beyond the mere provision of relief goods. As we increasingly were doing in recent years, we also implemented programs that prepared people to respond to calamities, using local resources. Indeed, many church partners collected what they had and distributed these to those in need. Utilizing our training program and resource network, we also taught them mitigation measures to counter the effects of these unwanted incidents. In some areas, we also followed up relief work with rehabilitation projects to help the victims return to their normal way of living. These rehab projects included transitional shelter project in Bansalan, Davao Del Sur in which 21 families whose houses were totally destroyed by earthquake were provided with transitional shelter and a shelter Repair Kit distribution for 71 families affected by typhoon Tisoy in Albay and Bansud, Mindoro.

TYPHOON MANGKHUT



BAGGAO, CAGAYAN

Provision of educational support to 125 children. They were provided with more than 1 school uniforms, foot wear (slippers, shoes and socks), bags and school supplies. The project helped the children with their school needs and lessened family expenses for sending them to school.

TYPHOON TISOY



MATNOG, SORSOGON

Provision of Family food packs to 1300 families from the 5 remote Islands of Matnog affected by Typhoon Tisoy. Their houses were destroyed and livelihoods were affected.

BANSUD, ORIENTAL MINDORO

Provision of Shelter Repair Kits to 17 Aeta Families whose houses were destroyed by Typhoon Ompong.

PHILRADS in partnership with SHALOM Ministries International Church distributed family food packs to 150 Families from the different barangays of Legazpi City –they were affected by the typhoon Tisoy. Also, 50 pastors were provided with shelter repair kits (6 GI Corrugated sheets, 1 plain sheet, 1 kg umbrella nails) to be used in repairing their houses.

PHILRADS together with local church partners provided relief assistance to 626 families in Tiwi Albay and Sagnay, Camarines Sur.

II. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Inherent to PHILRADS philosophy which is to go beyond relief, helping the victims of disasters through its community development efforts by implementing sustainable and integrated projects. Our sustainable projects in 2019 focused on strategies that we hope could serve the families displaced by disasters in the long-term and sustainable basis which includes the Community Based-Livelihood Skills Training in partnership with the local government Unit and Technical Education Skills Development Authority (TESDA).



PHILRADS conducted series of Skills training in Itogon, Benguet and Baggao, Cagayan Province-these areas were hardly hit by typhoon Ompong last September, 2018. In Itogon, Benguet, the project beneficiaries were small scale miners who lost their jobs due to the stoppage order of all small scale mining activities which has said to be the cause of the landslide which killed less than 100 people in Ucab, Itogon, Benguet. In Baggao, the target recipients were farmers whose source of income were affected by the typhoon.

A. COMMUNITY-BASED LIVELIHOOD SKILLS TRAINING

PHILRADS, in partnership with the Union Church of Manila and TESDA-CAR, conducted Community-Based livelihood skills Training from July 2019-October 2019 at Itogon Training Center, Tuding, Itogon, Benguet which was intended for the 104 Small Scale Miners who were displaced and by Typhoon Ompong and were not included in the first 2 batches of skills training conducted by TESDA and PHILRADS in 2018. This project aimed to restore their earning capacity and alternative means of livelihood away from mining activities.

This project is designed to help 104 IDPs (internally displaced persons and their families) who were not included in the first two batches of skills training to restore their earning capacity and alternative means of livelihood away from mining activities.

B. BAGGAO LIVELIHOOD ASSISTANCE AND SKILLS TRAINING

This project was designed to help 100 displaced corn farmers from Baggao, Cagayan to recover from the effects of Typhoon Mangkhut which destroyed farms and houses in 2018. After emergency food relief and rehab assistance, the families were still struggling to cope up and meet their basic needs. Although, they were able to replant their fields in the past year, their recovery was minimal while their previous financial obligations piled up. They needed alternative means of livelihood that can augment their incomes from their traditional produce.



Just like in Itogon, Benguet, PHILRADS organized a similar skills enhancement project in Baggao, Cagayan with the same purpose of increasing the capacity of the 100 people to meet their needs and look after the welfare of the families.

B. BAGGAO LIVELIHOOD ASSISTANCE AND SKILLS TRAINING

They were trained on important skills, including technical and practical courses, that are in demand in Baggaog and surrounding towns which can be practiced by men and women in their communities like:

1. Automotive Servicing NC I
2. Driving NCII
3. SMAW NCII
4. Electrical Installation and Maintenance NC II
5. Bread and Pastry NCII
6. Dressmaking NCII

Aside from the skills trainings, PHILRADS provided the project beneficiaries with Free TESDA Assessment and National Certificate, Transportation Allowance, Seed Capital amounting to 5,000 Pesos each.
