Humanitarian RESPONSE

In times of major disasters and emergencies, both natural and man-made, PHILRADS provides quick and appropriate response through relief assistance. Relief Response involves needs assessment, resource mobilization and provision of relief assistance. PHILRADS vast experience in relief operations, partnerships with local churches and Christian organizations and strong linkages with government agencies have paid off in terms of efficient and effective delivery of relief to target recipients.



From January to December, PHILRADS implemented projects against the backdrop of the continuing economic crisis aggravated by the recent calamities: typhoon Tisoy, Taal volcanic eruption, community lockdowns due to COVID 19 outbreak, typhoon Quinta, Rolly and Ulyses. PHILRADS was able to serve a total of 15,701 Families or 78,505 individuals through Family Food Packs Distribution, Cash Assistance for Pastors and Provision of DRR Equipment.

AN OUTBREAK OF HOPE AMIDST THE PANDEMIC



It was late December 2019 when the COVID-19 Outbreak started in Wuhan, China and was announced by the World Health Organization (WHO) as a public health emergency of international concern last January 30, 2020. It was also the day when the Philippines announced its first COVID-19 case and on February 1, the first death was recorded in the country in which both were Chinese nationals. The number of confirmed COVID-19 cases and deaths continue to rise internationally and locally which prompted the Philippine government to impose Luzon-wide community lockdown last March 16, 2020, which were also followed by local government units around the country, in the hope of containing the virus and slowing its spread.

During the lockdown, the populace's movement was restricted to their homes, and only one household representative with quarantine pass issued by the local government was allowed to go out to buy basic needs such as food, medicines, and other essential things. Air, water, and land travels were only restricted to diplomats, uniformed workers, and those that do humanitarian work. Mass gatherings were prohibited and physical classes were also discouraged which prompted schools to shift to other educational means such as online classes and modules. Moreover, non-essential business establishments were shut down which left millions of Filipino workers jobless. This has led PHILRADS to help the government in providing food and hygiene kit to the affected families.

PHILRADS has done its part in supporting the government's efforts by responding to the needs of 3,412 families in and around Metro Manila who were affected by the reduced economic activities due to the implementation of the Enhanced Community Quarantine (Lockdown) in the entire Luzon from March 2020. PHILRADS provided food that is good for 5 days to these families.

The government has done its best to provide for its people. In fact, the president signed an executive order that includes an emergency subsidy or the Social Amelioration Program (SAP) under the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) amounting 5,000php to 8,000php to low income households

based on prevailing regional minimum wage rates on top of the relief packs that were given during the initial weeks of quarantine. However, not all low-income households were given the financial subsidy and relief goods.

PCEC-PHILRADS, in partnership with HUMEDICA, has done its part in supporting the government's efforts by responding to the needs of 2,300 families and 500 medical front liners in the National Capital Region and in the selected barangays in Rizal Province.

The National Capital Region was targeted because it is the epicenter of the Coronavirus Disease in the country and Rizal province close to NCR which is also high risk area. A total of 15 barangays were selected based on their location and capacity. The said activities were properly coordinated to the office of the Mayor, Municipal Social Welfare and Development (MSWDO),



and the Local Government Unit (Barangay) through the coordinators in the area.

The family food packs includes 15kg rice, 5pcs corned beef, 5 pcs canned tuna and 300grams chocolate drink and wash items (2 pcs hand soap, 1 bar laundry soap and 500ml alcohol).

BRING BACK “HAPPY” IN HAPPYLAND



On April 18, 2020, a fire swept through Barangay 105 "Happyland", Tondo, Manila, displacing hundreds of families. Most of these families were already experiencing difficulties due to the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) implemented as a response to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Most of them are daily wage earners, and having limited mobility meant that their sources of income have also been blocked.

Last April 24, PCEC-PHILRADS, together with IHELP Team and the Police Community Affairs and Development Group, distributed family food packs to 255 families displaced by the fire. These families are temporarily staying at Amado Hernandez Elementary School, Vicente Lim Elementary School, and St. Martin de Pores.



SHEPHERD'S PROJECT: CASH ASSISTANCE FOR PASTORS *affected by recent disasters and the pandemic*

Because church gatherings have been indefinitely postponed due to the ECQ, churches have no income in the last couple of weeks, and therefore most pastors who have no other resources have a difficult time in providing for their families' physical needs. For full-time pastors, this challenge can be overcome through constant prayer and encouragement with each other in the Body of Christ.

For the pastors in Batangas and Cavite, their year 2020 has already started rough as they faced the Taal Volcanic Eruption in January. The impact of the eruption, however, lasted longer, as it affected the livelihoods of the people in those areas. Particularly, most of the pastors rely on their churches' income from members' tithes and offerings to provide for their daily subsistence.

On April 28, 35 pastors affected by volcanic eruption received a cash assistance amounting to P2,500.00 through the Shepherd's Project initiated by PHILRADS. The cash assistance will support the pastors in providing the basic needs of their families for one week.

On the same day, PCEC-PHILRADS' Shepherd Project put smiles on the faces of 37 pastors from Aklan, Capiz, and Antique. These areas were badly hit by Typhoons Ursula and Tisoy late last year. At the beginning of this year, their families were still recovering from the effects of the typhoon. With the Enhanced Community Quarantine in effect in their areas since March, they had a difficult time to provide for their families' basic needs. Most of them rely on the churches income. With prohibited mass gatherings, there is also a limit on the possibility for these pastors to look for other sources of income. Yet they continue to serve their flock and provide spiritual guidance as they best could.

“BLESS OUR TSUPER (DRIVERS)”

It has been more than 5 months since jeepney drivers stopped their operations because of the COVID-19 pandemic. They are among thousands of public transport drivers affected by the lockdown imposed by the government. 5 months have passed but until now, jeepney transportation is given very limited permission to resume operations compared to other public transport vehicles. Since it has been months that they had no source of livelihood, most of them were already suffer financial loss which led them to beg on the streets of Metro Manila. Some were even forced out of their apartments and had to live inside their jeepneys with their families because they had no money to pay for their rent.

This has prompted PHILRADS to launch the “Bless the Tsuper” project last August to help support the jeepney drivers by providing relief packs that could feed them and their families for at least a week while they wait for the resumption of jeepney operations or find alternative means of livelihood. The distribution project was implemented weekly as God provides and

documentation was done and posted on the organization’s Facebook page.

Some people who have seen the social media posts had expressed their willingness to partner with PHILRADS, to support its cause and advocacy of helping the people who are in need by providing cash or in kind donations. These includes groups or companies, churches and other organization like GCF Peel and United Filipino American Foundation Inc. (UFAFI) and individual people.

As of September 4, PHILRADS had served a total of 355 families of Jeepney drivers. Prior to the distribution, PHILRADS had already collected, validated, and listed the names of the drivers to facilitate faster distribution following the physical distancing protocols. Also, sharing of the gospel was done to ensure that PHILRADS was not only addressing the physiological needs of the people but also their spiritual need. A New Testament Bible in Tagalog version and a one-verse evangelism card was included in the relief packs.



A GLINTS OF HOPE


The current pandemic has affected millions and millions of people around the globe. In the Philippines alone, the coronavirus disease made more than 200,000 people sick, claimed lives of nearly 4,000, shutdown several business establishments which left thousands of Filipinos jobless, slowed down the country's economic growth and disrupted the normal life of people. COVID-19 cases and deaths are still on the rise and its end was unknown to everyone even to the experts. Scientists and pharmaceuticals around the world are competing to develop vaccines which were believed to be the solution of this wide-spread disease however, its completion would probably be available in 2021 or the succeeding years.

While waiting for such vaccine, people have to adopt to the new normal which involves wearing of masks and face shields, hand hygiene and physical distancing. Mass gatherings are still prohibited which is why, several churches in the country have not resumed physical church services yet. Some who are blessed with technology maximize the use of virtual or online worship. Due to postponed weekly church activities, economic decline and limited transportation, the church's income has also decreased for the past couple of months and therefore, pastors and church leaders who are dependent on the church's financial support and have no other means of livelihood have difficulty providing for their families' physiological needs.



This has further been aggravated when the first typhoon entered the Philippines. Typhoon Vongfong (locally known as Typhoon Ambo) made its first landfall in Eastern Samar last May 14, 2020 destroying several houses, infrastructures, and fishing boats, caused flash floods, damaged agriculture and crops, displaced thousands of people and killed at least five individuals. This prompted Global Intercultural Services (GLINTS), a non-government organization based in Wheaton, Illinois, USA, to raise funds to help the pastors and their families who were affected by the typhoon Vongfong and COVID-19 in the Samar area.

PCEC-PHILRADS, in partnership with GLINTS, was able to provide cash assistance to a total of 62 Pastors in Region 8 of which 16 were pre-selected by GLINTS and were implemented by Pastor Ferdinand Consebido. The rest were implemented by PHILRADS, in which, 46 Pastors located in Dolores, San Policarpio and Oras, Eastern Samar were carefully selected by PHILRADS and validated with PCEC Adopt-A-Pastor program to avoid duplication and maximize target beneficiaries. Each of the 46 pastors received cash assistance of PHP 2,500.00 through cash remittances and bank transfer. The project was implemented last August 24-28, 2020.

MEDICAL RESPONSE



Medical PROGRAM

Recognizing the urgent needs of the Philippine Health Care System, PHILRADS together with its partners like COVID Mustard Seed Project, Humedica, FEBC and International Baptist Church of Singapore provided thousands sets of Personal Protective Equipment to 92 Hospitals and other government affiliated frontline agencies. With the given PPEs, we are able to help the receiving health care institutions in protecting their frontline health workers from being exposed to the virus and that they were able to provide quality care to their patients since they worry-less on getting infected.



Also, PHILRADS turnover 3 Anesthesia machines to three different hospitals on June 1, 2020, which were Lung Center of the Philippines, Mandaluyong City Medical Center, and San Juan Medical Center.

Moreover, PHILRADS team delivered 13 medical isolation tents to 6 different hospitals in the Northern Luzon and Eastern Visayas which are: Indigenous people's hospital in Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya, Panopdopan District hospital in Lamut Ifugao, Antique Medical Center, Caluya Municipal Health Office, Laguna Medical Center.

IMPACT AS BIG AS A MUSTARD TREE



When the Corona Virus outbreak started in Wuhan, China last December 2020, people imagine that it would become a worldwide pandemic. Even the World Health Organization announce it as a global health concern until the end of January since. The virus continued to spread and it was unstoppable. Some countries have taken the virus for granted that it ended up collapsing their health care system and had claimed many lives. Due to this, some countries have closed its borders to foreigners to prevent its further transmission in their nation. Since this is new, it is safe to say that no country was prepared to face the battle against this corona virus disease especially the Philippines.

During the early phases of the pandemic, the Philippines, like the other countries, was not prepared to face the battle against the Corona Virus Disease Pandemic. With the credit to the government, the government did their best to prevent the spread in the country. However, due to its newness, lack of information

and unpredictability, COVID-19 transmission was unstoppable. With the increasing number of confirmed cases and death including health care workers due to lack of protective gears in the early months of the outbreak in the country, the medical front liners took the initiative to call for donations of personal protective equipment.

PHILRADS, in partnership with FMC Research Solution and Sinoworld Inc., launched the COVID Mustard Seed Project to help the medical and non-medical front liners by providing them personal protective equipment that they need to somehow shield themselves from contracting the virus. These include face masks, face shield, protective or hazmat suit, shoe covers and surgical gloves. PHILRADS also partnered with the Philippine National Police - Police Community Affairs and Development Group (PNP-PCADG) for mobilization, transportation and delivery of the goods to the respective institutions and in coordination with the local government unit and hospital administration or representative.

With these partnerships, PHILRADS was able to serve a total of 84 COVID-19 hospitals and frontline institutions within the National Capital Region (NCR) and some cities and provinces within Luzon. The COVID Mustard Seed Project started in March and was completed in June 2020.

PHILRADS TURNED-OVER **3 UNITS ANESTHESIA MACHINES** *to 3 public hospitals in Metro Manila*



Across the country, there is a shortage of ventilators that hospitals need to provide care for people who have COVID-19. Hospitals suggest it could be a matter of life and death to get more ventilators before COVID-19 hits its peak in the Philippines.

On June 1, 2020, PHILRADS Humanitarian Response Team, together with its partner organizations, the FMC Research Solution and Sinoworld Inc. represented by its President Mr. Fai Ting Chua and his wife Melody Chua and the Police Community Affairs and Development Group represented by Police Brigadier General Joselito Daniel, jointly turned-over 3 units of AX-400 Anesthesia Machines (high – end anesthesia machines that can also be used as ventilators for COVID-19 patients) to San Juan Medical Center, Lung Center of the Philippines, and Mandaluyong City Medical Center.



The said machine is one of the most vital medical devices needed to treat seriously ill patients who needed respiratory support due to breathing difficulties caused by the COVID-19. The anesthesia machines were installed and put into test with the help of the manufacturer via an online meeting application to ensure the functionality of the machine.

PROVISION OF SANITARY KITS TO LOCALLY STRANDED INDIVIDUALS IN BULACAN

Thousands of Locally Stranded Individuals flocked at the Rizal Memorial Stadium as they wait for their grant of the 'Balik Probinsya Program' from the government. Due to continues influx of people, health risks kept rising. People also became less aware of physical distancing and other health protocols.

In interviews of PHILRADS with a number of stranded individuals, concerns were raised about burdens they experienced from the pandemic. No face masks were available. Even washable face masks were not being washed or not used due to unsanitary washing areas. These prompted PHILRADS to make a move on providing face masks and alcohol to help stranded individuals abide by the health protocols to keep them safe.

On July 30, 2020, PHILRADS Humanitarian Response Team, led by John Mel Sumatra, delivered 850 packs of surgical masks with alcohol to the designated temporary housing facility for the Locally Stranded Individuals in Barangay San Manuel, CSJDM, Bulacan while waiting for their trips. The said donation was received by the Camp Coordinator, Engineer Magat from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Field Office 3. This was made possible by the financial support of GCF Peel.



TURN-OVER OF **MEDICAL ISOLATION TENTS** *to 5 district and provincial hospitals*



With the rapid increase in the number of COVID-19 cases in the Philippines, some hospitals have already closed its doors to COVID patients because they have reached their maximum bed capacity. Meanwhile, the “*Balik-Probinsya*” program of the government which aims to bring home the locally stranded individuals from the National Capital Region to their respective provinces for good, had also contributed significantly to the rapid rise of COVID cases in the provinces.

This prompted PHILRADS to initiate the distribution of medical tents to serve as COVID isolation rooms and waiting area for patients to be tested from the

virus in some district hospitals and provincial government units.

The tents were distributed to 4 different district and provincial hospitals and municipal health offices namely: Indigenous People’s Hospital in Aritao, Nueva Vizcaya (3tents), Panopdopan District Hospital in Lamut Ifugao (3 tents), Antique Medical Center in San Jose de Buena Vista, Antique (2 tents), Caluya Municipal Health Office in Poblacion Caluya (2 tents) and Laguna Medical Center in Sta. Cruz, Laguna (2 tents). The remaining tent was left for PHILRADS use.

Mobilization and transportation was in partnership with the Philippine National Police - Philippine Community Affairs and Development

Group (PNP-PCADG). A Deed of Donation was also signed by PHILRADS and the donee institution as an agreement of the terms and conditions set by the organization.

The 13 medical isolation tents were made possible by Giesecke and Devrient Asia Pacific Limited - Philippines and FMC Research Solution in which a project proposal was sent, reviewed and approved by the said companies.

After the pandemic, the tents can also be used as medical isolation during disease outbreak and can act as temporary structure for disaster response. The tent measures 3m x 6m, it is collapsible, easy to be transported and easy to install.
