We see to it that every relief package we give to the community are good for two weeks just to cover their physiological needs, in compliance to the "do no harm" principle while doing the relief and development response.



# SUPER TYPHOON ROLLY LIVELIHOOD RECOVERY/BALIK PANGKABUHAYAN PROJECT

## Tiwi Albay and Virac Catanduanes



In 2020 several fisherfolks in Tiwi, Albay, and Virac, Catanduanes lost their source of income (fishing) because of the series of typhoons that hit the Bicol Region during the last quarter of 2020. In God's grace PHILRADS through its BALIK-PANGKABUHAYAN Project distributed and delivered 267 pieces of fishing equipment, 45 Fish Cage, 8 units of motorized fishing boats, and 9 unmotorized Banca in Tiwi, Albay, and 152 families received repair kits, fuel, fishing gears, and cash, and 2 Big units of the motorized wooden fishing boat to 34 families in Virac, Catanduanes.

At the same day together with I Am Redeemer and Master Evangelical Church continued to provide assistance to families affected by Typhoon Goni in Barangay Sugod, Tiwi, Albay by providing cash assistance to 100 fisherfolks. This was made possible by the support of TEARFUND.

This initiative is part of our Balik-Pangkabuhayan Project which aims to provide livelihood assistance to fisher folks affected by recent disasters in the Bicol Region.


# SUPER TYPHOON ULYSSES LIVELIHOOD RECOVERY/BALIK PANGKABUHAYAN PROJECT

1. Our relief and response is rooted in the Lord's Compassion (Matthew 25:34-46).
2. Our relief and response are timely and relevant Eccl. 3:1 / Gal. 6:9 every relief operation was done in haste in proportion to the needed response, not reckless, having careful consideration and assessment of every disaster situation. This quick, timely, and well-prepared response is made possible by the compassionate heart and generosity of our donors.
3. Our relief and response is done in grace and fairness. In our relief distribution practices, we adhere to the principles of grace and fairness, this is seen in our beneficiary selection process. We prayerfully select every possible beneficiary using sound guidelines to ensure fairness and that every needy person will benefit.
4. Our relief and response cater to the whole well-being of men (1Thess. 5:23). in every response, the beneficiary is cared for spiritually and given psycho social counselling
5. A "DO NO HARM" principle during relief operations was observed always by the Staff and Volunteers. Philrads , values the sanctity of human life see(Exodus 20:13). For all men and women are created in the image of God (Genesis 1:26-27) . We make sure that every leader, staff, and volunteer practices this in every operation.

This capacity-building activity is in line with Philrads' commitment to improving its processes and approach as we continue to serve the people in Christ's name.


